5 Ways to Be Supportive

It's Not Taboo

- Don't be afraid to start conversations about mental health
- Creating a safe space makes talking about mental health less daunting

Leave Your Judgment at the Door

- · Stigma around mental health is real. Be open and patient.
- Show empathy: "I hear you" "You're not alone"

"It's Not All in Your Head"

- Recognize their bravery and vulnerability
- · Let them know their feelings are valid

You Matter

- Remind them that your door is always open/ you're only a phone call away
- Encourage them to seek support any time they need
